ACROSS

- Fuel that cannot be easily made or renewed. It is used up.
- A blend of 20 percent biodiesel with 80 percent petroleum diesel.
- Fuel that can be renewed or easily made.
- A substance that is not toxic or poisonous.
- A waste by-product of the biodiesel making process.
- A discharge or something that is given off; generally used in regard to discharges into the air.
- Fuels that result from the compression of ancient plant and animal life formed over millions of years.
- A colorless, odorless, highly poisonous gas, CO, formed by incomplete combustion of a carbon or a carbonaceous material, such as gas.

DOWN

- The process of removing glycerin from soybean oil.
- Pure biodiesel fuel.
- Any organic (plant or animal) material that is available on a renewable basis.
- How a liquid is resistant to flow; thickness or thinness.
- An environmentally safe, low polluting fuel for most diesel internal combustion and turbine engines.
- A colorless, odorless noncombustible gas with the formula CO₂ that is present in the atmosphere.
- Capable of being decomposed by the action of biological agents, especially bacteria.
